Marigold Curtis has strengthened our links with the Royal Botanic Gardens and they have made a significant donation of plants to our gardens. Thank you Marie and Marigold.

<u>Completion of revised 'Management Plan'</u>. At the completion of this document, many works that have been on hold will be able to be put into motion. The final draft will be displayed for public comment in the near future and a report will be included in the next newsletter.

THE GUIDING FRIENDS have been showing people through the gardens as usual but in much smaller numbers due to the cold and wet winter we have been having. The Friends are currently redesigning the coloured brochure distributed to motels and handed out to visitors, a very useful tool showing the layout of the gardens and significant trees, their history and importance.

The Botanic Gardens Report Book

For the sixty years from 1898 to 1958 we have a fantastic source of information in the Botanic gardens Report Book. Each of the Curators, Scoborio, Donald and Leitch, regularly reported to Council on the state of the town's street trees and gardens. Their reports, carefully hand written in the formal style of the times, tell the story of their triumphs and disappointments. Scoborio reported to Council four times a year. His report as transcribed, follows.

Warrnambool February 7th 1898 To His Worship the Mayor

and Town Councillors.

Gentlemen,

I beg to present a report on the condition of the Gardens and plantations under my care. At the present time, which is not of the brightest, the long drought and excessive heat have been very disastrous to all plant life. I never recollect such dry weather as have been experienced the last two years. It is with the greatest difficulty to keep the plants and shrubs alive. With regard to spring and summer flowers such as Annuals and other tender plants, they were completely burnt out of the ground. Other plants that were more hardy I have managed to keep alive by continued watering. I have lost many plants and shrubs, and I fear I shall lose many more if it does not rain very soon. There are many large shrubs such as Buddleia Veronicas, and Pittosporums and others that are out of reach of the water services. I have to cart water to them. Altogether the outlook at present is not very encouraging. I fear I shall have to ask you for assistance to replace what is lost, especially in flower seeds. It has been impossible to save seeds as the flowers were burnt up before they were half open. I have a small stock of some seeds in the nursery but not nearly sufficient nor yet the varieties that are required.

The established trees in the streets are doing fairly well, with a few failures. The newly planted trees, through keeping them well mulched and watered are doing better than I expected. There are about a dozen failures, principally Norfolk Island pines. I think I have sufficient to make good any failures.

The Gardens generally you will find in good order. The birds of all descriptions are doing well, which is a great attraction to the Gardens. I have been able to preserve a very fair display of flowers, which were greatly appreciated by visitors of which there have been a great number.

In later reports Scoborio wrote:-'...in Raglan Parade 14 of the trees had the leading shoots broken off by some mischievous persons..." He also spoke of horses and cows being allowed to wander in the streets and '...persons attending the Saleyards tying their horses to the trees, it's a great nuisance...' Bats and birds seem quite insignificant in comparison. P.V.
